2. Procurement details

Description of the project	



Conservation International (CI) works to conserve and restore nature for the benefit of people in the most important places on Earth. Agricultural production, while providing essential food and livelihoods for local communities, often drives deforestation, conversion and degradation of natural areas. To better advocate for conservation, we must first understand the degree to which agriculture is responsible for the conversion, identify the commodities that are responsible for the conversion and quantify the degree of responsibility. This information can help inform setting of sector and jurisdictional level commitments to remediation via restoration actions.

In Brazil, CI has been working across the Amazon to conserve the remaining natural areas, restore habitat and ecosystem services across the biome and incentivize regenerative agriculture production systems. To achieve these objectives, we look for opportunities to create stronger links between retailers and consumer goods companies dependent on agricultural production to support conservation and restoration within production landscapes. Within the state of Para, we are exploring how to better drive investment into restoration in important areas for biodiversity conservation, freshwater conservation and carbon removals.

To better target our efforts to engage companies in restoration in Para, we must understand the key drivers of deforestation and conversion of natural ecosystems in Para and to quantify these impacts by commodity. This will enable us to build a stronger business case for remediation via restoration actions. Within Para state our initial analyses show that 15% of the land is under agriculture production and the vast majority of this is pasture for cattle. Annual crops account for 1.5% of the land in Para and tree crops less than 1%.

Definition of the goods or services required with detailed specifications

Our objective is to pinpoint hotspots of forest loss in Para, identify the drivers of conversion and the level of responsibility that each of the major commodities plays and identify which commodities have the greatest gaps in compliance with the Forest Code that could drive uptake of restoration initiatives.

CI is looking for a consultant to map deforestation in the state of Para and to identify and quantify the top 5 agricultural commodities driving deforestation and quantify the percentage of deforestation due to their expansion.

Map Agricultural Area: Map the current production area in Para for cocoa, acai, soy and pasture and identify deforestation hotspots for these commodities in the state.

Deforestation Analysis: Quantify the percentage of deforestation in Para driven by each of the 5 key agricultural systems – cocoa, acai, palm oil, soy and pasture over the past 5 years and project anticipated losses based on a business-as-usual scenario over the next 5 years.

Estimate the reforestation potential in the commodity production areas + the amount of reforestation necessary for Forest Code compliance: Using the best available data, the analysis should identify priority areas for reforestation within the commodity production zones and estimate the degree to which farms are out of compliance with the Brazilian Forest Code and the amount of restoration necessary for these commodities to reach compliance. These estimates can leverage work done by CI to develop a restoration potential map for the state.

3. **Offeror requirements:** The below listed criteria represent the minimum requirements for all offerors responding to the RFP.



Proponents will need to demonstrate understanding of the assignment and relevant technical expertise in conducting agricultural land use and deforestation mapping and quantifying the degree of deforestation associated with different tree and row crops. The Proponent should also have familiarity with agricultural production systems in the Amazon region of Brazil.

- a. Experience conducting GIS land use and land use change analyses for agricultural commodities
- b. Proven track record of quantifying deforestation from different agricultural systems in the Amazon region
- c. Demonstrated professional-level fluency in oral and written English
- d. Familiarity with the Brazilian Forest Code
- e. Expertise in priority-setting for biodiversity and ecosystem restoration

Technical Proposal

The Offeror should include details on personnel, equipment, and contractors who will be used to carry out the required services.

Cost Proposal

- The cost proposal is used to determine which proposals are the most advantageous and serves as a basis of negotiation for the award of a contract.
- The cost proposal must be all-inclusive of profit, fees, or taxes.
- Additional costs cannot be included after award, and revisions to proposed costs may not be made after submission unless expressly requested by CI should the offeror's proposal be accepted.
- Offerors must provide a detailed budget showing major expense line items. Offers must show unit prices, quantities, and total price. All items, services, etc. must be clearly labeled and included in the total offered price.
- All cost information must be expressed in USD.
- The cost shall also include a budget narrative that explains the basis for the estimate of every cost element or line item.
- Supporting information must be provided in sufficient detail to allow for a complete analysis of each cost element or line item.
- CI reserves the right to request additional cost information if the evaluation committee has concerns about the reasonableness or completeness of an Offeror's cost proposal.
- If selected, the Offeror shall use its best efforts to minimize the financing of any taxes on goods and services, or the importation, manufacture, procurement, or supply thereof. If the Offeror is eligible to apply for refunds on taxes paid, the Offeror shall do so. Any tax savings should be reflected in the total cost.
